

Vehicle Safety

The St. Louis Police Department reminds you when parking your car to:

- Lock your car. Remove keys.
- Keep packages out of sight. Secure large items in your trunk.
- Do not leave radar detectors, stereos, phones, laptop computers or other easily removable valuables in plain sight. If you can, take them with you.
- Remove all AC adapter cords from view.
- If you place items in your trunk, please do so before arriving at your destination.
- With cold weather, remember to not leave your car running unattended.

Curfew

All boys and girls under 17 years of age must be off the streets and away from public places by 11P.M. Sunday through Thursday and by Midnight on Friday and Saturday.

Parents of juveniles in violation of curfew ordinances are liable for fines.

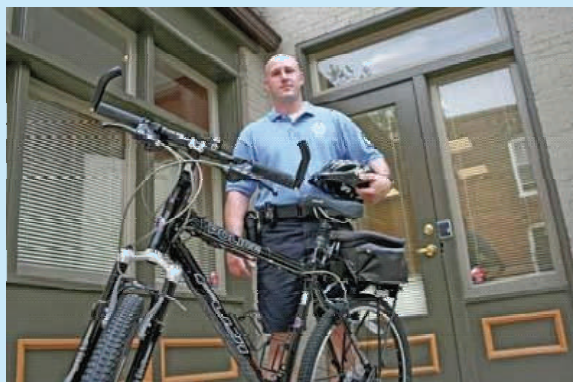
Forest Park Southeast
Bike Patrols

You may have been greeted recently by police officers on bicycles. This is a successful initiative that utilizes police officers on bikes to patrol the residential sections of Forest Park Southeast. The initiative is headed by CB Security, a patrol company founded by Charles Betts, 9th District policeman and is sponsored by Washington University Medical Center. Charles Betts was 9th District Officer of the Year in 2006. The company employs officers who are familiar with the Forest Park Southeast neighborhood and who are dedicated to a continued decrease in crime.

Through the initiative the officers are on patrol on average of 20-25 hours a week. The bike patrols have been very successful in reducing crime and developing a positive rapport between the police and the community.

What types of problems should I report to the Citizens' Service Bureau?

All problems that deal with City services should be reported to the Bureau. These would include problems with refuse collection, street maintenance, traffic control signals and signs, street lights, requests for building inspections and health inspections, stray or vicious dogs, accumulations of trash and weeds, air pollution, defective public sidewalks, maintenance in City parks and recreation facilities, and other related City service problems. If you do not know whether or not your complaint is under the jurisdiction of the City Government, merely contact the Citizens' Service Bureau for clarification of referral information.
